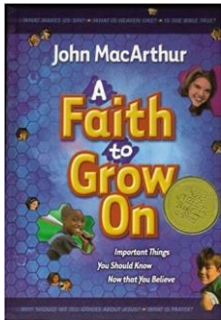


## Teaching Your Children – One Chapter at a Time

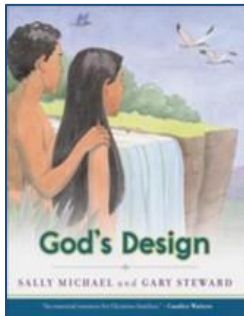

Here are some recommendations from our elementary children's collection, on the tall shelves against the moveable wall. These are all on the top shelf.*

A Children's **Bible** is always a good first choice and we have several suggestions if you don't already have one. Find these at number J 220.5



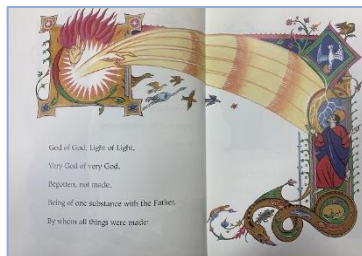
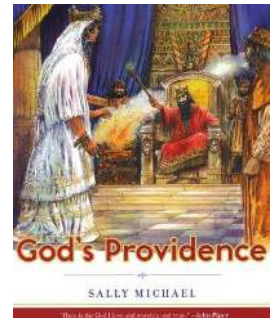
**A Faith to Grow On: Important Things You Should Know Now That You Believe** (J 230 MacARTHUR) helps kids understand basic elements of faith by taking difficult-to-understand topics and presenting them in a way kids can grasp.

**God's Promises** (J 231 MICHAEL) shows how we can trust in God's promises we find throughout the Bible, with applications and suggested activities



**God's Providence** (J 231 MICHAEL) helps children understand God's divine guidance in the world, and learn to rest in God's sovereign care with help from personal applications and activities in each chapter

**God's Design** (233 MICHAEL) is an important book that introduces what it means to be a man or woman, including gender roles and how these things have been undermined by our culture.



**I Believe: The Nicene Creed** (238 NICENE) is a short, beautifully illustrated book that encourages conversation. The Nicene Creed expands on the Apostles' Creed with more specifics especially about Christ and the Holy Spirit

On the second shelf down you will find lots of **biographies**, so you can pick one suited to the age and interest of your child.
