### **What is the Mission of Careers in Transition?**

CIT's mission is to provide assistance for all job seekers pursuing employment in a secure environment and to offer resources for professional, technical, spiritual and emotional support.

### **How does CIT operate? What is the process?**

Working one-on-one with our job coaches you will learn new techniques and be coached to expand your personal network to locate opportunities that are based on your unique skills and life experiences and you will be held accountable for results.

### **Why should I participate in CIT?**

Participating allows you to be exposed to job search techniques you may not have used in the past and provides "accountability" to follow through with these techniques. Our coaches will attempt to help you move forward with your search by working with you on a schedule that works for you. Don't do job search alone. Most job search experts agree that regular coaching and networking improves both the speed and likelihood of job seekers finding their next position.

### **Is there a cost to participate in CIT?**

None. CIT is an inter-faith ministry of Cherry Creek Presbyterian Church and is open to all free of charge. All we ask is that you place a priority on learning and applying the tools that we teach so you can succeed with your job search.

### **What type of job seekers is CIT geared to?**

CIT is for all types of job seekers, from recent graduates to senior workers. The principles we teach apply to all job seekers. CIT can be particularly helpful if you have recently lost a job and feel that you need to pursue a new direction in your career.
